Following are two letters I wanted to share with you.

My mom has a nonprofit organization, A Mission of Love that coordinates procurement, transportation, and utilization of necessities to furnish schools, orphanages and hospitals. Primarily The MoL focuses on Latin America and The American Indians, specifically in South Dakota. Ambulances, fire trucks, school buses, and so many more impressive things have been delivered that have literally changed people's lives throughout the world. MoL is able to do this because it utilizes a government program--The Denton Program--that will fly humanitarian aid in the bellies of cargo planes worldwide, at no cost to the donor. They have currently delivered over 50 flights in 20 years. Additionally, trips are taken to construct homes and buildings, sometimes in a matter of days. My Mom and her organization delivered relief goods to the hurricane victims, the tsunami victims and is currently working on an airlift to the earthquake victims of Haiti. She has very little or no overhead, as her warehouse space is donated and her organization is 100% volunteer (including my Mom—she takes no salary). If you are looking for an organization to donate money or goods to, please consider my mom's organization, The Mission of Love. I can assure you that 100% of donations go to the people. I have gone on several trips with my Mom and it is truly life-changing. Thanks for reading and your consideration.

Live from Japan - A Plan for Haiti Relief Quilts

I am writing to you today from the Hotel Granvia in Kyoto Japan, where a group of 30 quilters is joining me to tour the art and history of Japan...and attend the Tokyo Quilt Festival!

We are following the terrible news about Haiti from here, and everyone here feels the same way I know you do - what can we do to help?

I have contacted the director of [Mission of Love](#) and Kathy has agreed to ship and distribute quilts to those in need, in Haiti. We are still putting together the details but for those of you who wish to send the comfort of a quilt, here is the plan:

[Mission of Love](#) is backed by the Federal Government's Denton Program - airlifting food, supplies, etc. to those affected by disasters. You can send quilts directly to MOL in Ohio, or if you are near us in Colorado drop your donation quilt(s) to the eQuilter offices and we will ship them to MOL in Ohio.

Over the years, [Mission of Love](#) has distributed thousands of quilts from eQuilter customers to 9/11 families/survivors, Pine Ridge orphans, and Katrina survivors.

If you want to have confirmation of delivery, please obtain a tracking number when you ship the package so you can confirm delivery yourself. This is a massive project and there are no extra resources to confirm delivery. Likewise do not expect a thank you letter from the recipient. They cannot afford even a stamp.

Put a label with your name, your location, and a message of hope on the back... and know that when the quilt is placed into the arms of someone in desperate need, they will read your message and receive your prayers and comfort.

As you know, eQuilter gives 2% of all sales to charity, with an emphasis on orphans, children and families in need, and disaster relief.
